

MENU INSTRUCTIONS

Everything in the menu needs to be bilingual. It is limited to 1 page.

You'll need a restaurant name in English and Spanish, as well as your own name.

There are six sections, which need to be titled English and Spanish.

- breakfast – desayuno
- lunch – almuerzo
- dinner – cena
- desserts – postres
- drinks – bebidas
- appetizers – aperitivos

Each menu item needs three prices

- USD
- MXN
- EUR

Use the website www.xe.com/ucc to convert prices.

Remember that EUR and MXN use commas instead of decimals in their numbers.

Each section needs 4 items.

Drinks, appetizers, and desserts can be individual items or fancy.

- basic: agua
- intermediate: agua frío
- advanced: una taza de agua frío

Breakfast, lunch, and dinner need to be fancy meals, not individual items.

- basic: huevos y tocino
- intermediate: huevos revueltos y tocino crujiente
- advanced: dos huevos revueltos y tocino crujiente con pan tostado y su opción de

fruta.

Use as many of the foods from your vocabulary sheet as possible. Remember, one of our goals for this assignment is to be able to read other menus without notes. Therefore, you may not look up new words in the dictionary or on the internet.

Remember to flip your noun-adjective phrases. There are two types of them.

vegetable soup – sopa de verduras

This noun-adjective phrase uses the word “de” in between because you can say soup of it makes sense.

fried bacon – tocino frito

This noun-adjective phrase doesn't use “de” because it wouldn't make sense to say bacon of fried.

Also remember to agree your nouns and adjectives in gender and number!!
